The center manages more than 360 seminars and conferences on a wide range of different topics every year. A BRIEF UPDATE ON OUR CURRENT INTERNATIONAL PROJECTS:

We are currently coordinating 6 Erasmus+ projects in the field of Higher Education and Adult Education. These projects aim to improve accessibility, development, and digitisation of international adult education. In the projects we are accompanied by partners from various European countries. All projects are EU-funded.



Al in Language Teaching

Artificial Intelligence in Adult Education and Self-Learning: Providing personalized and adaptive learning experiences with emphasis on language learning

This project's main goal is to raise awareness and motivation for teaching and learning opportunities with Al-technologies. The project will familiarize teachers and self-learners with the advantages of Al-supported learning and encourage them to create more engaging and interactive learning experiences by using Al technologies such as speech recognition, machine translation, and natural language processing.

Over the past few months, we have been working intensively on the topic of 'artificial intelligence in adult education' with a particular focus on language learning to understand the usage behaviour, knowledge and needs of teachers and self-learners.

In addition to an extensive literature review, we focussed on developing a quantitative research design in the form of an online survey. Conducting online surveys enables us to precisely capture the needs and requirements of our target 01.10.2023 - 31.03.2026



group. By asking specific questions, we determine the extent to which teachers and self-learners already use AI, their attitude towards AI and their needs and expectations of AI-supported solutions.

Our partner organisation Cebanc organised an intercultural food festival where people from different countries prepared and shared their traditional dishes.

Cooking and eating together was used as a valuable method to break down educational barriers and promote intercultural understanding. Such interactive and cultural exchange formats emphasise the importance of food as a bridge between cultures and as a tool to promote education and integration.

During the Science and Technology Day organized by TUC on 2/11/2024, an interactive installation was set up demonstrating eShadow in combination with traditional shadow theatre. More than 4000 visitors had the opportunity to see and play with eShadow.

AI in Higher Education

AI-Powered Teaching Guidance for Educators:

Revolutionizing teaching practices by equipping educators with Al-driven tools and methodologies while fostering ethical, transparent, and effective AI usage in education.

We are excited to announce the official launch of the AI in Higher Education project, which began on December 31st, 2024 and will last for 30 months. This innovative initiative aims to empower educators with cutting-edge tools and methodologies, enhance collaboration between universities and AI experts, and promote ethical AI usage in education. A key focus is preparing future educators—pedagogy students—with the skills to harness AI effectively in their teaching careers.

The SAMUELE project enables the European University Continuing Education Network (eucen) to promote lifelong learning in higher education and empower individuals through inclusive, flexible, and equitable educational opportunities. Planned activities include comparing national approaches, developing a self-assessment tool for universities, and creating a strategy to advance lifelong learning across Europe. It started in January 2025 and will last for 3 years.



Mobility4LLL

Expanding Language Learning Opportunities

JGU supports mobility programs that foster language exchange between Germany, France, and Spain. Our latest initiative, launched in September 2024, offers older learners (primarily 50+, but open to other interested individuals) the opportunity to engage in enriching language tandems and cultural excursions.

Upcoming Activities:

- French-German Online Tandem March 2025
- Spanish-German Online Tandem Spring/Summer
 2025

- Group Mobility in Dijon Second week of October 2025
- Group Mobility in Valencia Late November or early December 2025

Participants will connect with native speakers from our partner universities in Dijon and Valencia, improving their language skills while experiencing authentic cultural exchange.

Further international activities:

Annually Summer School taking place in August

Over three weeks in August (04.08.2025 – 22.08.2025), students from around the world can participate in daily German-language courses for all proficiency levels. These courses are complemented by a variety of afternoon activities, including excursions and cultural studies.
