From 04 to 22 August 2025, 60 students from 20 different countries convened in Mainz to participate in our Summer School Programme. Over a period of three weeks, participants enrolled in daily German-language courses ranging from A1 to C1 levels. These courses were complemented by a variety of afternoon activities, including excursions to nearby cities and cultural studies such as Intercultural Training, German history, German literature, German politics, and so on. Mobility4LLL

Expanding Language Learning Opportunities



JGU supports mobility programmes that foster language exchange

between Germany, France, and Spain. Our latest initiative, launched in September 2024, offers older learners 50+ the opportunity to engage in enriching language tandems and cultural excursions.

Participants will connect with native speakers from our partner universities in Dijon and Valencia, improving their language skills while experiencing authentic cultural exchange.





Preparatory visits 15 April 2025, Dijon

Both preparatory visits for the 50+ group mobilities in Dijon (06–11 October 2025) and Valencia (02–08 November 2025) have been successfully completed. Together with our partners at the Université de Bourgogne Europe and the University of Valencia, we worked on the strategic framework and pedagogical aspects of the programmes. The constructive exchanges and on-site visits offered valuable insights and laid a solid foundation for the success of Mobility4LLL initiative.

Self-assessment Model for Universities embracing Lifelong Learning in Europe



The primary objective of this project is to develop a comprehensive and transnational Self-Assessment Model Framework tailored to the specific context of University Lifelong Learning (ULLL) in European universities. This project started in January 2025 and

will last till the end of 2027.

Peer Learning Seminar 18 June 2025, Brussels

In a first step SAMUELE has conducted a national survey across 18 EU countries on how they organise and implement ULLL within their institutions and collected an extensive questionnaire from +100 HEIs. As part of the project, the peer learning seminar in June 2025 was organised to gain initial insights into the data analysis of the conducted survey.



Stories4all

Developing methods and tools for teachers to integrate digital storytelling in teaching activities to address the need for inclusive educational interventions



The objectives of the project are to develop methods, tools, and skills for creating digital stories inspired by diverse cultural backgrounds to promote cultural

and language awareness to address the need for inclusive educational interventions that promote empathy and creativity by adopting a community building approach in the developing the appropriate skills of its target group and facilitating them to design and implement engaging learning activities exploiting the cultural capital of EU countries.





2nd Transnational Partner Meeting 15–19 September 2025, Chania

The second *Stories4All* transnational meeting in Chania, Greece, marked the start of the project's new phase. Partners explored digital tools like *eShadow* and *Coursevo*, combined Design Thinking with Shadow Theater, and developed creative storytelling ideas. A hybrid training followed, bringing together participants worldwide to create, present, and reflect on their own digital stories. Further details with first training results are available here.

Al in Language Learning

Artificial Intelligence in Adult Education and Self-Learning: Providing personalized and adaptive learning experiences with emphasis on language learning



This project's main goal is to raise awareness and motivation for teaching and learning opportunities with Al-technologies. The project will familiarise teachers and self-

learners with the advantages of Al-supported learning and encourage them to create more engaging and interactive learning experiences by using Al technologies such as speech recognition, machine translation, and natural language processing.
